#### What are the location based issues?

**Nothing to offer visitors** 

Dwindling footfall/ passing trade No places for young people to go, increasing anti-social behaviour

New out of town developments effecting town centre demise

Poor retail mix (No restaurants/too many nail bars, etc) Lack of town centre affordable homes keeps people away from town centre and doesn't help young people stay.

Poor advertising about all the good things the area offers

Too many empty shops and buildings making the town look derelict and increasing crime

Failure to capitalise on the visitors passing through the area

Through traffic, risk to pedestrians

The untidy appearance of some shops & derelict buildings is bad for investment and a poor reflection of the town

An aging population and aging volunteer force






#### **LDP2 Plan 2019**



#### **Community Council Plan**



Creating a visitor centre along with improved accessible baby change and modern facilities was a key driver when taking over the toilets from PKC.

## The BARI Building










An inspirational example of regeneration for the community,
